5.1 Contribution of IQAC in enhancing awareness about Student Support Services

- Freshers were informed about the goodness of student support services during orientation programme.

- Remedial coaching is given to the slow learners.
 - Faculty members are encouraged to organize Alumni batch meet to strengthen their relationship.
- Awareness program for Online Certificate Courses and Value Added Courses were conducted in the college by the respective Staff members and HODs.
- The Institutional Government and Management Scholarships are available and disbursed on time.

- The college has a student union that has a well defined function.
- For the past twenty six years, the students have been bringing out a hand written Tamil Magazine Uthayabaratham, a collection of creative writings by the students and staff members, and the students are also encouraged to participate in “Pavurnamikaviyarangam” every month.
- Students, staff members and one earning parent of students are covered in Group Insurance Policy schemes.
 - Emergency medicines are kept in the college for the needy students.
 - Placement cell coordinators of all departments take part to inform the students about the process done by placement. 30 companies visited our campus for campus recruitment and 315 students were well placed.
 - Mentor system is followed
 - Subsided newspaper circulation is done to students.

- Student calendar is distributed to all the students in the beginning of the academic year which contains all the information
- Alumni Association acts energetically to contribute for both academic and infrastructure development
- Students are encouraged to participate in the Quiz programs, Elocution and essay writing competitions, Debates etc., organized by the other Institutes.
- Entrepreneurial skill was induced on the budding students. EDC programmes were organized.
